Chair Emeritus, Miami Science Museum

Dan Bell, now retired, co-founded Kos Pharmaceuticals in Miami and served as its President and CEO, and then Chairman of the Board, until its sale in 2006. Kos developed, manufactured, and marketed proprietary prescription cardiovascular drugs. From its inception with three employees in 1988, it grew to nearly 1,500 employees and \$1 billion in revenue, and was recognized by *Fortune* magazine in 2005 as the sixth fastest growing company in the US.

Prior to founding Kos, Dan was Executive Vice President and Chief Operating Officer of Miami based Key Pharmaceuticals, Inc. Prior to moving to Miami in 1977, Dan was an executive with Ford Motor Company in Dearborn, Michigan.

With his wife, Trish, Dan served as Co-Chair of the Miami Science Museum, and they are members of the Board of Trustees of the Florida United Methodist Children's Home and founding members of the Advisory Board for South Florida Urban Ministries. Dan is also actively involved with Chapman Partnership for the homeless, most recently as a member of its National Planning Council. He also has served in an advisory capacity to the Bishop of the Florida United Methodist Conference. During his professional career, he was a member of the Miami Chamber of Commerce Board of Governors and was a founding Board member of Miami's Beacon Council, as well as a member of several corporate boards.

The Bells, married more than 40 years, have long been active philanthropists in the Miami community, principally focused on improving the lives of those who otherwise lack opportunity and resources. The Bells were recognized as Miami-Dade's "Philanthropists of the Year" in 2010 and were honored with the "Alvah P. Chapman Humanitarian Award" in 2009.
